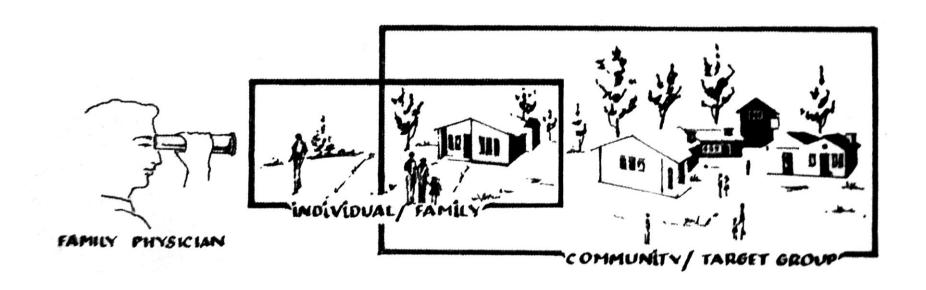

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Introduction

Welcome to the general practice module. General practice was first introduced into the curriculum as a subject in 1993 at the inception of this faculty.

The module is designed for you to learn those aspects related to general practice which you will not learn elsewhere in your 5 year programme. It introduces you to the basis and principles underlying general practice which would help you to deliver good quality primary continuing and comprehensive care for the patient. The learning methods are focussed more towards the patient who is ill rather than only the diseases the patient has.

The main objective of this module is to equip you with information that you would need to set up and carryout quality general practice in the community.

Aim

At the end of the module you should acquire the basic knowledge, skills and attitudes that are important to deliver general practice with commitment, compassion and care.

Objectives

At the end of the programme you should be able to;

- 1. Understand the patient centered philosophy of general practice.
- 2. Describe the process of care in a general practice.

- 3. Identify how presentations and management differ from those seen in hospital wards.
- 4. Develop the attitude to use every opportunity to promote health and prevent diseases and to support/ cooperate with the implementation of national health programmes.
- 5. Describe logistics involved in setting up an independent practice.
- 6. Manage common problems presenting in general practice

Main Content areas

- 1. Principles, concepts and scope of general practice.
- 2. Family and its impact on health and disease.
- 3. Psychological, social and cultural effects on health and illness behaviour.
- 4. Consultation and doctor patient relationship.

- 5. Clinical decision making and principles of management in general practice.
- 6. Organizing a general practice (solo/group) and home as the clinical setting.
- 7. Anticipatory care and opportunistic health promotion.
- 8. Some commonly seen symptoms in primary care.
