





PREPARATION

Priorities have changed

Many stressors

Time, attention and priorities have changed



A few key decisions to make

- What are the learning outcomes you want to achieve?
- What is the learning environment you want to create?
- Will the content be accessed synchronously or asynchronously?
- What content needs to be presented?
- Who should have control over participants?

Learning outcomes...

- Deliver factual content
 - online presentation (synch or asynch)
- Generate a discussion/critical thinking
 - Flipped classroom
 - Discussion boards/groups social media

Chat-box

- Group assignments
 - Breakout rooms

Learning environment...

Where will students be located - they may be in an environment that's not suited for the educational activity

Presentation of content

- Same rules that apply to a face-to-face presentation
- Can be more liberal with text
- Avoid videos

Control....

Decide who will control the slides

Assistance to monitor the chat-box

- Ensure participants know how to take part (ask questions, use breakout rooms etc.)
- Plan how to deal with challenges



Before the presentation...

Make ground rules available to participants

Do a test-run

- Have backup plans
 - If you get disconnected
 - If your presentation doesn't show
 - Your mic stops working
 - Your camera stops working

Before the presentation...

Sign onto the platform early and test

The view participants will see of you avoid distracting backgrounds!

Check connection speed by asking a colleague to connect

Close other programmes and mute sounds

DELIVERY

During the session

- Reminder of ground rules
- Share and point
- Do not read
- Make use of features
- Check chat box
- Regular breaks and check-ins deliver in small chunks
- Shorter the better!

Presentation tips and tricks

Imagine yourself on the other side of the presentation

- Emulate your 'in-person' style
- Make eye contact with the web-cam
- Slow down avoid speed reading
- Use stories, jokes etc.
- Appearance not too casual

Presentation tips and tricks cont.

You will always be seen!

Don't get too close to the camera

Shut off mic and camera if a tech problem arises

 - formative/summative assessment


Longitudinal engagement
